1. The instant second bail application has been filed under Section 483 of the BNSS, 2023 on behalf of the accused-applicant-Naveen Temani.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has entered into a compromise to settle the proceedings *qua* him by paying an amount of Rs.10 Lacs against the total allegedly defrauded amount of Rs.80 Lacs.
3. During the course of the hearing, the complainant, a senior citizen female, aged about 83 years confined to a wheelchair, marked her physical presence before this Court along with her nephew, who is also physically challenged. The complainant vehemently submitted that out of sheer frustration with the ongoing proceedings and the apparent lack of justice delivered by the investigating agency, she is being compelled to enter into a compromise and was forced to settle her legitimate claim of Rs.80

Lacs for a mere sum of Rs. 10⁰⁰ Lacs. She further submitted that she is at fag end of her life, residing entirely alone without any close relatives to take care of her, and has been the helpless victim of a grave white-collar economic cyber crime committed by the accused persons.



4. Learned Public Prosecutor has apprised this Court *vis-a-vis* the case records and the current status of the investigation.

5. In light of the aforesaid submissions, it has been observed that the present matter constitutes a classic and unique case that has deeply shocked the conscience of this Court. Taking serious note of the light of the victim and the gravity of the alleged cyber crime, this Court deems it appropriate to summon the higher police officials.

6. Consequently, the Director General of Police (DGP), Rajasthan, as well as the Superintendent of Police (SP), Cyber Crime, are directed to appear before this Court through V.C., and the concerned Investigating Officer is also directed to remain personally present before the Court on the next date of hearing.

7. Learned Public Prosecutor is directed to procure and place the entire case records before this Court prior to the next date of hearing.

8. Additionally, the State authorities are directed to ensure that if the elderly complainant chooses to stay in the city for the purpose of these proceedings, all boarding and lodging arrangements of the highest quality standards shall be made available for her. The entire expense for the same shall be borne by the State. It is made categorically clear that any failure in the aforesaid regard shall be taken seriously by this Court.
