The Rajasthan State Human Rights Commission is one of the leading state commissions in the country. In a short span it has achieved many milestones in its mission for the protection and promotion of human rights. The main mandate of the State Commission is to function as a watchdog for human rights in the state. Under the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993, human rights are defined in Section 2(d) and are those justiciable rights that can be enforced in a court of law in India. Most of the universal human rights as defined in the UN Charter are included and are being vigorously enforced. The Human Rights Commission is an autonomous, high-power human rights watch body that derives its authority from the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993.

ABOUT THE COMPETITION

Kanoria School of Law for Women is organising “Parley 6.0: Debate Competition” on 8–9 September 2026, offering students a platform to engage with diverse social and legal issues through critical thinking and persuasive argumentation.

The competition aims to strengthen research, analytical reasoning, public speaking, and presentation skills, while fostering confidence, composure, and intellectual rigour. Parley Debate Competition encourages aspiring legal professionals to articulate their perspectives with clarity, logic, and conviction. It provides participants with an opportunity to explore contemporary issues, challenge perspectives, and develop well-reasoned positions, preparing future legal professionals to communicate and advocate their ideas with confidence.

THROWBACK

Over the years, Parley Debate Competition has emerged as a distinguished debating platform, fostering critical thinking, constitutional discourse, and meaningful dialogue among young legal minds.

- **Parley 5.0: Debate Competition** on 13 and 14 June, 2025, in association with the Rajasthan State Human Rights Commission. As compared to last year’s record, the competition has yet again received a remarkable response from all over the country.
- **Parley 4.0: National Debate Competition** on 16 and 17 May, 2024, in association with the Rajasthan State Human Rights Commission. Compared to last year’s record, the competition has once again received a remarkable response from all over the country.
- **Parley 3.0: National Debate Competition** was organised on 5 and 6 June 2023, with 80 teams (160 participants) from across India participating.
- **Parley 2.0: National Debate Competition** was organised on 30th & 31st May 2022, where participation of more than 85 teams (170 participants) from all the prominent law institutes of the country was witnessed.
- **Parley National Debate Competition 2021** was held on 6th February, 2021, which received a phenomenal level of response, as 40 teams (80 participants) from all over India participated in the competition.

RULES OF THE COMPETITION

RULE 1: ELIGIBILITY & TEAM COMPOSITION

- i. Members of the team must be valid undergraduate students pursuing a recognised Bachelor of Laws program. (Note—Bachelor of Law means a 3-year or 5-year integrated course in law recognised by the Bar Council of India.)
- ii. The team shall comprise two participants.
 - Students from the same law college/university can participate as a team.
 - Students from different law colleges/universities can participate as a team.
- iii. A maximum of 3 teams per institute/college/university are allowed to participate. (Selection on a first-come, first-served basis).

NOTE: Winners of previous editions of the Parley Debate competition are not eligible for this competition.

RULE 2: TOPICS OF THE COMPETITION

- **Preliminary (Round 1)** – Right to die with dignity is a facet of the right to life
- **Semi-Final (Round 2)**— Female intestate succession reform or retention
- **Final (Round 3)**—Developed nations bear greater responsibility for combating climate change

RULE 3: STRUCTURE OF THE COMPETITION

The Competition shall consist of three online rounds:

- a) The Preliminary Round;
- b) The Semi-Finals Round; and
- c) The Final Round

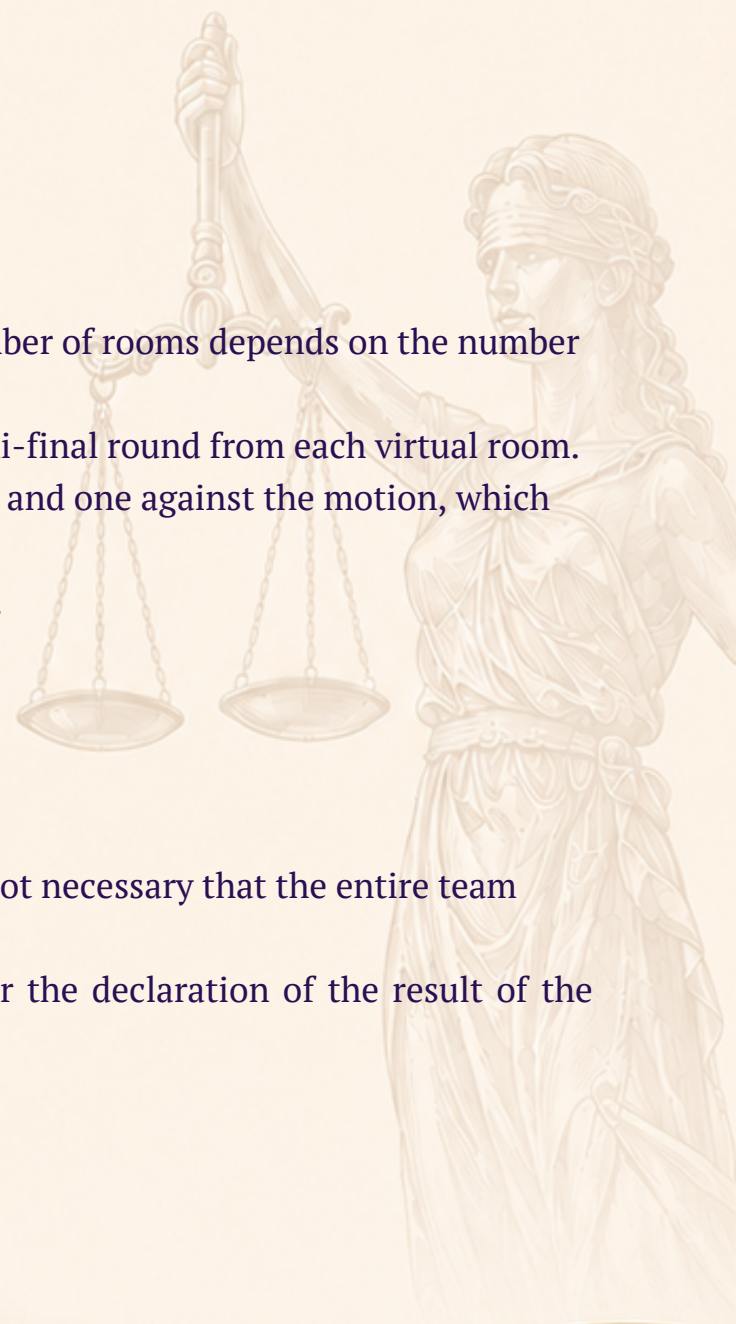
1. PRELIMINARY ROUND:

- i. Competition will be conducted online through virtual rooms. The number of rooms depends on the number of entries received by the college for the competition.
- ii. A proportionally equal number of participants will qualify for the semi-final round from each virtual room.
- iii. Each team shall consist of two speakers, one speaking for the motion and one against the motion, which will be decided by the participants themselves.
- iv. Each candidate will be allotted 3+1 minutes in the preliminary round.
- v. There will be no rebuttal in this round.
- vi. No questions will be asked in this round.

2. SEMI-FINAL ROUND:

- i. Selection for the semi-final round will be on an individual basis. It is not necessary that the entire team qualify for this round. Only 16 participants will be selected.
- ii. The motion will be given by the organisers to the participants after the declaration of the result of the preliminary round.
- iii. Each candidate will be allowed 3+1 minutes.
- iv. The motion will be decided by a draw of lots.
- v. There would be no rebuttal in this round.
- vi. Questions may be asked by the judges in this round.

Note: Be prepared for both motions in advance



RULES OF THE COMPETITION

3. FINAL ROUND:

- i. The top 6 participants will qualify for the final round.
- ii. The motion will be given by the organisers after the declaration of the results of the semifinal round.
- iii. Each candidate will be allowed 5+1 minutes.
- iv. The motion would be decided by a draw of lots.
- v. There would be no rebuttal in this round.
- vi. Questions will be asked by the judges in this round.

Note: Be prepared for both motions in advance.

RULE 4: LANGUAGE

The medium of competition shall be English only.

RULE 5: DRESS CODE

The dress code for the competition is Western or Indian formals. Participants must adhere to the same.

RULE 6: CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION

The basis for the evaluation of debate will be on the following parameters:

- Organisation and Clarity
- Presentation Style
- Knowledge of Subject
- Originality and Ingeniousness
- Ability to deal with questions concisely and effectively (only in semi-final and final rounds).

RULE 7: IMPORTANT DATES

- Last Date for registration— **03 September 2026**
- Date of Debate Competition—**08-09 September 2026**

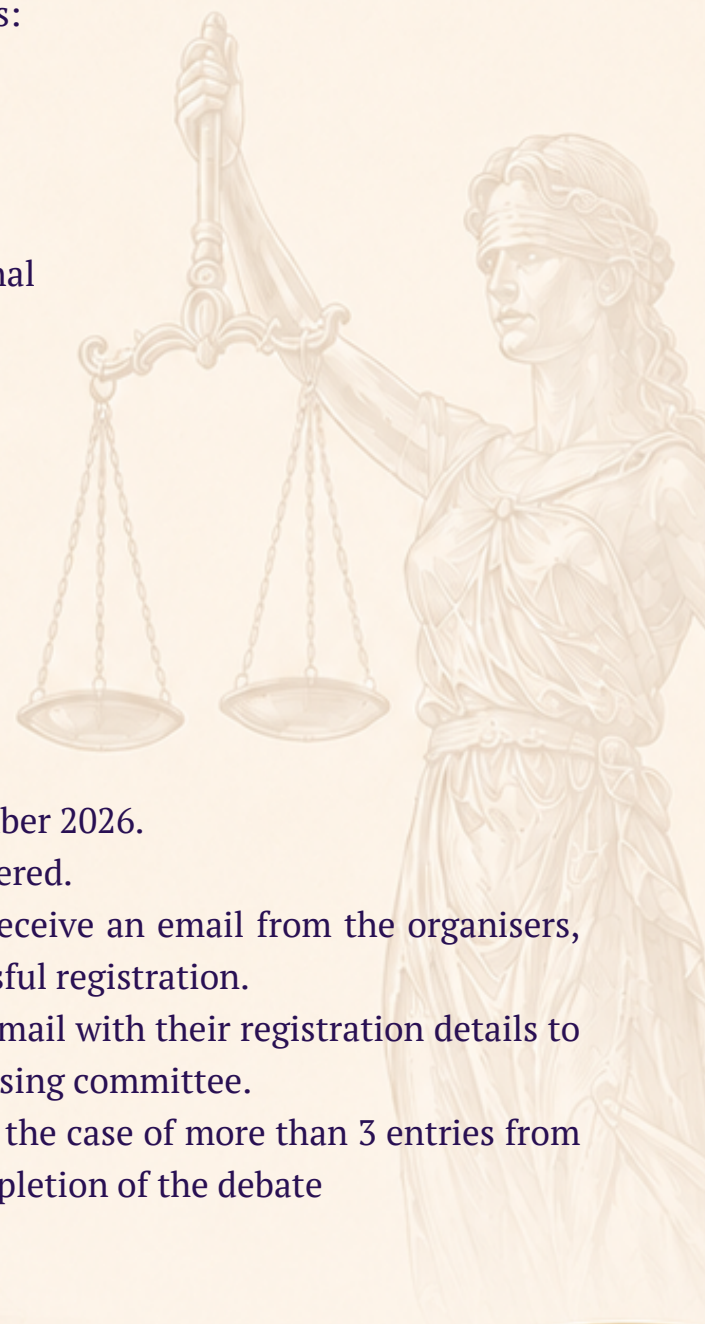
RULE 8: REGISTRATION

The teams will have to register by filling out the Google Form:

Kindly complete and submit the registration form no later than 3 September 2026.

- The composition of the team cannot be changed once a team has registered.
- Upon successful submission of the registration form, the teams will receive an email from the organisers, providing them with their team code and informing them of their successful registration.
- If teams do not receive such an email, they may immediately send an email with their registration details to sociolegalrslw@gmail.com or directly contact the members of the organising committee.
- The registration fee is non-transferable and non-refundable. Except in the case of more than 3 entries from an institution, such amount will be refunded within one week of the completion of the debate



RULES OF THE COMPETITION

RULE 9: REGISTRATION FEES

The registration fee is Rs. 400/- per team.

RULE 10: GENERAL RULES

- The Speakers shall not disclose their identities and shall only represent themselves by the team codes allotted to them. Team codes shall be provided to each team after successful registration.
- The competition shall consist of 3 rounds, i.e., preliminary, semi-final, & final.
- It is mandatory to keep your college ID cards with you at the time of the debate competition.
- Use of foul or obscene language will lead to disqualification.
- Participants are allowed to use any source of information during the preparatory period. No book, document, or electronic gadget shall be allowed to the participant during the competition.
- The decision made by the panel of judges will be final and binding.
- Kanoria School of Law for Women reserves the right to alter or change the rules or procedures of the competition.
- The organisers shall not be responsible for any loss due to a slow or non-functional internet connection during the competition.

RULE 11: COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

If a team believes that a violation of any of the competition rules has taken place at any stage of the competition, the team shall, within half an hour of the completion of the round wherein a violation has allegedly occurred, register a complaint with the organising committee. Under no circumstances are the teams allowed to approach the judges with any complaints.

RULE 12: CLARIFICATION OF THE QUERIES

RULE 13: VIDEO CONFERENCING RULES

- All the rounds for the competition shall be conducted virtually. The video conferencing platform will be informed well in time through email.
- The link to the meeting ID and schedule will be provided to the teams through email.
- All the participants shall keep their microphones on mute at all times, except when addressing arguments. The speaker will unmute his/her microphone only after being invited to do so by the moderator and judges.
- The speaker must keep their camera on while presenting the argument.
- The participants shall report at least 15 minutes before their scheduled time. The organisers shall not be responsible for any loss due to a slow or non-functional internet connection during the competition.
- **Disclaimer: The rules shall be strictly adhered to. The organisers reserve the right to disqualify teams for deviating from the rules. The organisers will resolve any contingencies that may arise and will be the final arbiters regarding any doubts or grievances. The decision taken by the organisers shall be final. These rules are not exhaustive.**
